Potential significant effects:

Clearing of 321.9 ha of native vegetation, including locally significant vegetation and loss of conservation significant flora individuals; habitat degradation and loss of subterranean fauna individuals including loss of stygofauna species that have only been recorded within the drawdown area; removal of 321.9 ha of terrestrial fauna habitat, including potential habitat for the Northern Quoll and removal of Feaella 'PSE007' (pseudoscorpion) habitat which has only been recorded within the Development Envelope; water abstraction of up to 0.96 GL/yr; creation of Waste Rock Dumps (WRDs) which contain Potentially Acid Forming material; contamination of soil, surface water, and groundwater with toxic metals due to seepage from mine waste landforms [Tailings Storage Facility (TSF), heap leach facility and WRDs], and contamination of underlying groundwater due to mixing with waters formed in a pit lake after closure.

Preliminary key environmental factors:

Terrestrial Environmental Quality and Inland Waters Environmental Quality, Flora and Vegetation, and Subterranean Fauna.
