### **Potential significant effects:**

The proposal requires clearing of 146 hectares of native vegetation, within an area that has been previously disturbed through mining, exploration and pastoral activities. The proposal does not intersect banded iron formation, or priority or threatened ecological communities. Potential impacts from exposure of acid forming or weathering materials can adequately managed. At conclusion of mining, appropriate rehabilitation would occur to restore the land consistent with the pre-mining tenure.
