Referral Examined, preliminary investigations and inquiries conducted. Proposal not to be assessed under Part IV of the EP Act – No advice given.

### **Explanation of decision:**

The EPA considers that the likely environmental effects of the proposal are not so significant as to warrant formal assessment because the proposed site is located within a heavy industrial area, it has historically been cleared and the extent and consequence of the predicted impacts as a result of the proposal are predicted to be small scale. The EPA is of the view that the potential impacts of the proposal can be adequately managed through implementation of the proposal in accordance with the referral documentation, the proponent's management and mitigation measures. The EPA considers that other statutory processes such as Part V Division 1 (Clearing of Native Vegetation) and Division 2 (Works approval and licence) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, the *Dangerous Goods Act 2004* and the management of potentially contaminated soils in accordance with the *Contaminated Sites Act 2003*, can regulate the facility.

**Appeals:** This decision is appealable. Appeals close 24-02-2020. Appeals are administered by the Office of the Appeals Convenor.
