Explanation of decision:

Several preliminary key environmental factors are complex due to the specific vegetation within the proposal area and the extent of potential impacts associated with the proposal. However, it is considered that sufficient baseline information is available for the EPA to undertake an assessment on the information provided by the proponent with additional information required to inform cumulative and holistic assessment of the proposal. Detailed assessment is required to determine the extent of the proposal's direct, cumulative, holistic and indirect impacts, and whether the EPA environmental factor objectives can be met. **Appeals:** Decision is not appealable.
