Potential significant effects:

The proposal includes clearing of up to 842 hectares (ha) within a development envelope of 1,251 ha with potential to impact a Priority Ecological Community and conservation significant flora and fauna, including potential habitat for the black-flanked rock-wallaby and the night parrot. The proposal has the potential to impact local hydrological processes, remove subterranean fauna habitat, alter the quality of the Jones Creek Catchment. There are identified Aboriginal heritage sites within the development envelope.

Preliminary key environmental factors:

Flora and Vegetation, Terrestrial Fauna, Subterranean Fauna, Hydrological Processes, Inland Waters Environmental Quality, and Social Surrounds (Heritage).
