Referral Examined, preliminary investigations and inquiries conducted. Proposal not to be assessed under Part IV of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act) - Dealt with under Part V (Clearing)

Explanation of decision:

The EPA considers that the likely environmental effects of the proposal are not so significant as to warrant formal assessment. The predicted extent and consequences of the impacts on fauna, flora and vegetation and water quality on the surrounding environment are minor. The EPA is of the view that the potential impacts of the proposal can be adequately managed through the implementation of the proposal in accordance with the referral documentation and the proponent's management and mitigation measures, and the potential environmental impacts of the proposal on native vegetation clearing can be effectively and appropriately assessed under Part V Division 2 of the EP Act (Clearing).

It is noted that other statutory processes relevant to this proposal include Regulation 15 Licence under the Wildlife Conservation Act 1950, Wildlife Conservation Regulations 1970 and the Mining Act 1978.
