## Potential significant effects:

The proposal will involve clearing of up to 350 hectares of State Forest and has the potential to impact on habitat for conservation significant fauna species. There are also potential impacts on terrestrial environmental quality, air quality, social surroundings, hydrological regimes and surface and groundwater quality (inland waters) from construction and operation activities, and production of air emissions.

## Preliminary key environmental factors:

Flora and Vegetation, Terrestrial Environmental Quality, Terrestrial Fauna, Inland Waters, Air Quality, and Social Surroundings.

**Level of assessment**: Referral Information (with additional information required under section 40(2)(a) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*).

The additional information, which will be published on the EPA website for a 3-week public review, is required for:

- EPA's assessment of Flora and Vegetation and Terrestrial Fauna (Black Cockatoos, Chuditch and Western Ringtail Possum); and
- EPA's assessment of Social Surroundings (Visual Amenity, Noise and Vibration).

**Explanation of decision:** The proposal raises several preliminary key environmental factors. The proponent has generally provided adequate referral information about the proposal, potential impacts, and proposed management measures to enable the EPA to undertake its assessment, however, additional information is required relating to Flora and Vegetation, Terrestrial Fauna and Social Surroundings.
