**Potential significant effects:**

Clearing of up to 55 ha of native vegetation, including 22.8 ha in Bush Forever areas and 2.8 ha of a Priority Ecological Community - Banksia Woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain. Loss of up to 27.6 ha of black cockatoo foraging habitat and 96 potential black cockatoo habitat trees. Disturbance of a contaminated site and impacts from noise and vibration.

Flora and Vegetation, Terrestrial Environmental Quality, Terrestrial Fauna, Hydrological Processes, Inland Waters Environmental Quality, Social Surroundings

**Level of assessment:** Referral Information with Additional Information (4 week public review)

**Explanation of decision:** Several preliminary key environmental factors are complex. The proponent has provided adequate referral information about the proposal, the environmental values of the area and the potential impacts of the proposal. However, additional information is required to assist the assessment of the proposal including: contextual information of the environmental values immediately surrounding the development envelope; detail of environmental management measures for the key environmental factors; and environmental offsets for the potentially significant residual impacts.
