Referral Examined, preliminary investigations and inquiries conducted. Proposal not to be assessed under Part IV of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act) - Advice Given.

#### Explanation of decision:

The EPA considers that the likely environmental effects of the proposal are not so significant as to warrant formal assessment because the existing environment is highly modified from existing development, and the extent and consequence of the predicted impacts as a result of the proposal are predicted to be small. The EPA is of the view that the potential impacts of the proposal can be adequately managed through implementation of the proposal in accordance with the referral documentation, the proponent's management and mitigation measures, and implementation of the EPA's advice given to other relevant decision making authorities.

It is noted that other statutory processes relevant to this proposal may include development application processes, heritage site disturbance and native vegetation clearing that will require consideration in accordance with the Rottnest Island Authority Act 1987, Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972 and Part V Division 2 (Clearing) of the Environmental Protection Act 1986, respectively.
