Potential significant effects:

The proposal has the potential to impact on **Flora and Vegetation** and **Terrestrial Fauna** through the clearing of 10.25 ha of remnant vegetation in excellent to good condition including the Banksia dominated woodlands of the Swan Coastal Plain IBRA Region PEC (Priority 3) and conservation significant fauna habitat; and **Inland Waters** from development impacts to surface and groundwater quality and hydrology.

Preliminary key environmental factors: Flora and Vegetation, Terrestrial Fauna and Inland Waters

- Details of how the proposed conservation area counterbalances the residual environmental impact.
- Further details of how identified impacts will be avoided, reduced, minimised and managed.

Explanation of decision:

Several preliminary key environmental factors are complex. Detailed assessment is required to determine the extent of the proposal's direct and indirect impacts, and how the environmental issues could be managed. A public review is required to enable public review and comment of additional assessment information.
