Referral Information with additional information required under section 40(2)(a) of the Environmental Protection Act 1986.

Other details

The updated documentation is to include additional information that considers the management and potential impacts to Cockburn Sound during product transfer from the cargo vessel. The additional information will include an updated environmental management plan with a detailed spill response for the offshore component. Consideration is also to be given on the potential impact of nutrient enriched groundwater to the environmental values of Cockburn Sound. Further consultation with the Cockburn Sound Management Council is required.

Explanation of decision:

The EPA considers that it has enough information so that it can undertake the assessment on Referral Information, however the EPA has requested some additional information. Assessment is required to determine the extent of the proposal's direct and indirect impacts to Cockburn Sound, particularly during the transfer of the liquid urea ammonium nitrate into Cockburn Sound, and how the environmental issues would be managed.
