Potential significant effects: There are potential impacts on: marine fauna from underwater water noise, entrainment/entrapment, vessel strike, introduced marine species, light pollution and plume dispersal and turbidity; coastal processes from removing sand over 15 years, potential disruption to natural sediment supply, changes to beach morphology and social surroundings from changes to water quality and operations being conducted within licenced fishing grounds potentially impacting commercial fisheries.

Other details

• Targeted consultation with commercial and recreational fisheries.

Explanation of decision:

Three preliminary key environmental factors may be complex and further assessment is required to determine the extent of the proposal's impacts and whether the environmental factor objectives can be met. The EPA considers that an assessment primarily on referral information is appropriate. Further information is required regarding underwater noise and artificial light modelling to determine the extent of potential impacts on marine fauna. Additionally, detailed information on understanding the potential impacts on commercial fishers and the likelihood of sand mining impacts on coastal processes and sediment dynamics.

Appeals: Decision is not appealable.
