Potential significant effects:

Potential impacts on: flora and vegetation from the clearing of 12,365 ha; terrestrial fauna from the clearing of habitat and from collision; subterranean fauna from construction and operation below the water table causing loss of habitat and individuals; terrestrial environment quality due to permanent rearrangement of terrestrial materials; social surroundings from construction and operation, noise, dust and vibration; inland waters from construction and operation impacts to Weeli Wolli Creek and Fortescue Marsh; landforms due to impacts on Fortescue Marsh; and greenhouse gas emissions from construction and operation.

Preliminary key environmental factors: flora and vegetation, terrestrial fauna, subterranean fauna, terrestrial environmental quality, landforms, terrestrial fauna, inland waters, greenhouse gas emissions, social surroundings
