Potential significant effects:

There are potential impacts on: flora and vegetation from the clearing of 14,850 hectares; terrestrial fauna from the clearing of habitat; subterranean fauna from dewatering of the pit and loss of habitat; terrestrial environment quality due to permanent rearrangement of terrestrial materials; social surroundings from construction, operation, noise, dust and vibration; inland waters from groundwater abstraction (below water table mining), drawdown, surplus water management and potential indirect impacts to Weeli Wolli Creek, Coondiner Creek and Fortescue Marsh; landforms due to impacts on Giles Point and Ophthalmia Range, cave structures and banded iron formations; and greenhouse gas emissions from construction and operation.

Preliminary key environmental factors: flora and vegetation, landforms, subterranean fauna, terrestrial environmental quality, terrestrial fauna, inland waters, greenhouse gas emissions, and social surroundings.
