#### **Potential significant effects:**

Potential impacts on: flora and vegetation from the clearing of an additional 16,802 ha of native vegetation; terrestrial fauna from the clearing of habitat; subterranean fauna from dewatering of pits and loss of habitat; landforms due to the potential impacts to mesa formations; inland waters from groundwater abstraction (below water table mining), drawdown, surplus water management, and potential impacts to Jimmawurrada Creek, Warramboo Creek, West Creek and Robe River; social surroundings (including aboriginal cultural heritage) from construction, operation, noise, dust and vibration; terrestrial environmental quality due to potential seepage and potential acid forming materials; and greenhouse gas emissions from construction and operation.

**Preliminary key environmental factors:** flora and vegetation, landforms, subterranean fauna, terrestrial fauna, inland waters, greenhouse gas emissions, terrestrial environmental quality and social surroundings (including aboriginal cultural heritage).
