Potential significant effects:

Clearing of native vegetation in good to excellent condition up to 606.9 ha including priority and threatened flora species, clearing of habitats for conservation significant fauna under the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* and *Environmental Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999*, hydrological and water quality changes including clearing of pools and drainage of habitat, impacts to subterranean fauna with unknown occurrence beyond the development envelope, potential impacts to of Aboriginal Heritage sites and values and greenhouse gas emissions.

Preliminary key environmental factors: flora and vegetation, subterranean fauna, terrestrial fauna, inland waters, greenhouse gas emissions, social surroundings.
