Following the lodgement of an appeal by the proponent under section 100(3) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* in respect to condition 10 of Ministerial Statement 765, and applying the recommendations of the appeals committee appointed to consider the appeal, the conditions and procedures contained in Ministerial Statement No. 765 are amended as follows:

1 Condition 10-1 amended

Condition 10-1 of Statement No. 765 is amended by:

- (a) deleting the words "one or more" in condition 10-1 and replacing them with "all"; and
- (b) inserting the word "and" after the semi-colon at the end of paragraph 2 of condition 10-1.
