The Development Envelope for the Proposal covers approximately 18 ha. Proposal description – including the key characteristics of the proposal <i>Provide as an attachment to the form</i>	<ul> <li>The Proposal includes;</li> <li>construction of a 4-legged roundabout at the GNH/ Apple Street/ Coondaree Parade intersection;</li> <li>widening of the GNH carriageway between 14.4–15.2 SLK, to a dual lane on both the northbound and southbound approaches;</li> <li>construction of a new entrance on Apple Street to the Road Train Assembly Area (RTAA);</li> <li>construction of a new access road between the service station on GNH and the Apple Street RTAA;</li> <li>provision of improved pedestrian and cycling infrastructure; and</li> <li>drainage upgrades on GNH in the north west extent of the Development Envelope.</li> </ul> Almost the entire Development Envelope has been previously cleared. The Development Envelope covers 18 ha, of which 8.75 ha is cleared and the remaining 9.25 ha is in degraded or completely degraded condition. The Development Envelope has been prepared to provide an upper limit to disturbance. The Proposal will require the clearing of up to 3.05 ha of native vegetation and 4.48 ha of non-native vegetation, planted by Main Roads in the 1980s.
