Preliminary Environmental

Factors:

Flora and vegetation, Terrestrial fauna, Inland waters and Social surroundings

Potential Significant Effects:

Future development permissible under LPS 25 may result in: the clearing of mature trees that may provide habitat for the threatened black cockatoos; impacts to local hydrology (including to wetlands, waterways and the Swan River), and potential amenity

impacts to sensitive receptors from existing land uses.

Protection: Potential environmental impacts associated with the scheme are unlikely to be

significant and can be managed through existing local planning scheme provisions and future planning processes, including through subdivision conditions. Future development within the scheme area may require compliance with legislation including Aboriginal Heritage Act 1972, Swan and Canning Rivers Management Act 2006 Contaminated Sites Act 2003. Future development should consider the Environmental Protection Authority's (EPA) Guidance Statement No. 3 Separation Distances between

Industrial and Sensitive Land Uses.

The EPA supports the retention of black cockatoo habitat, where possible, at the future subdivision/development application stage, and notes the proposed scheme provision related to requirements for replacement of street trees. The EPA expects future planning will ensure provision of appropriate buffers to and management of inland

waters values to ensure hydrological and ecological functioning is retained.
